The Observatory is in a National Park.

No smoking is permitted on the grounds or in the Perth Observatory.

The Observatory has Business Insurance for the General Public and Product Liability.

All our volunteers have Working with Children cards.

The Observatory has basic First Aid kits.

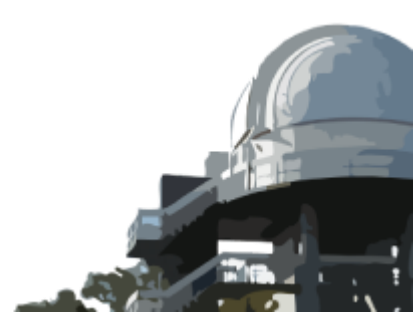
If you have students who have allergies and/or require specific medication, please bring it with you.

The Observatory volunteers are not allowed to give medication to students.

Disabled access is available to some, but not all, areas of the Observatory. Please let us know if you have students with disabilities.

Wheelchairs are available if needed.

Wheelchair access to the main building is via a ramp at the back of the main building





3. Planning your visit

A timetable will be sent to you before you visit, with breaks, start and finish times included.

Please note: Tours operate in all weather conditions. And activities are held both outdoors (weather permitting) and indoors.

Allow an extra 10-15 minutes for the journey time. One teacher is to be the nominated contact person and will always be responsible for the supervision of the students.

Teachers and supervising adults are asked to help maintain discipline and keep students in their groups during the visit.

Please bring a list of students and supervising adults.

Organise the students into groups before the visit.

There must be one supervising adult for each group. There is a maximum of 3 adults with each group due to space limitations in some activities.

Any adults over this number may be charged at the adult rate for Day Tours. No charge will be made for Education Assistants who are needed to attend to specific students.

Please ensure school bags can be zipped closed to ensure the local wildlife cannot access the contents. All bags will need to be left in a central area and cannot be taken into activity areas.

Each child should have a water bottle, particularly in summer. There is a drink fountain near the amphitheatre.

No food is available for purchase at the Observatory.

BYO morning tea or lunch at the Observatory is permitted – Please endeavour to take all your rubbish away with you. There are bins available, so please clean up afterwards

Check the Bickley weather forecast to ensure students are suitably dressed for the visit:

-  Footwear suitable for walking
-  Hats and sunscreen
-  Attire suitable for the weather conditions expected
-  It can be cold in Bickley in winter, so consider warm clothes
